

THE SABIN FAMILY

OF ANDOVER

William Sabin, a French Huguenot, who had fled to South England and Wales, came to America and settled in Rehoboth, in 1643. His first wife, name unknown at present, died in 1660; his second, Martha Allen, died in 1663. William died in 1687. By his first wife, he had:-

\*\*\*\*\* William (5), b. April 26, 1741; d. Nov. 18, 1814 ; a blacksmith during Revolution; m. Elizabeth Skinner, 1768; she d. 1798; 2nd m. Ilena Welch of Windham, Conn. They had :

Matilda I. (6) b. 1769; d. 1846; m. 1795 Rev. Solomon Spalding, son of Ht. Josiah Spalding of Pomfret; the Rev. was a graduate of Dartmouth College; b. 1761; he moved to New Salem, Ohio, 1809; died there 1816.

(It is said that the Rev. Spalding, above, wrote the Mormon Manuscript in 1812, while teaching school , after he had failed as a preacher. He also wrote a romance of the Wandering Children of Israel across Behring Strait to America and called this tale, " The Manuscript Found".

Joseph Smith bought this manuscript from Spalding's widow, and got his inspiration for the Mormon Bible from it.

The Rev. Spalding was very likely a Chelmsford BALLARD man.)
