DAVID JAMESON of ANDOVER, born in Scotland 1826, came here with his mother and sister Alice. Alice married John Flint, a cousin to the John Flint of Ballardvale.

David married Sarah Jane Farnum, daughter of Jeremiah Farnum and Sarah Wardwell, who was born 1827. Her mother was a daughter of John Wardwell and Sarah Trurrell. Capt. Levi Farnum was an uncle.

David and Sarah Jane, had :-David Trurrell, born 1851. John Trurrell, born -- d.y. Wm. Lewis, born 1853. Charles Albert, born 1854. George D. ; d.y. Julia Ann; d.y. Mary Ellen; d.y. David Mooar, b. 1856 Eddie Francis, b. 1858 Sarah Ann, b. 1859.

(One of these, Eddie, I think, shot the Parker boy by mistake.) Jameson bought the old yellow house - the Blanchard place- under the big elm tree,-which was torn down in 1833. On map it is marked Joseph P. Abbott(who m. Phoebe Lovejoy). Jameson began to build the old house over for an ell, but stopped because he could get the house above the Stratton place, at an auction.

A Mary Jameson married David (5) Barker of Pelham, N.H., Oct. 2, 1783.
