John (1) Lovejoy, son of Rowland Lovejoy and Elizabeth Neale, was born, according to Lovejoy research, in London, June 18,1622. He is said to have come to Andover in 1650. Mrs. Arthur Lovejoy said that family tradition has it that he came to Ipswich at the age of nine years, which would be 1631, (which I doubt). Said he was on the list of those coming in the Arbella, (which I doubt), unless he came as a child under a guardian, a Fowler, Mosely or Osgood, or Everard relatives of his wife.

(Savage said that John (1) married 2nd, Naomi Hoyt, daughter of John (1) Hoyt of Salisbury. Not so, it was John (2). He then mentions John (2) in the ship with John's(1) second wife. Savage had no note of any Lovejey in the lists.) (See Pope)

John, b. in 1622 was in Ipswich in 1651. He married Jan. 1, 1651 Mary Osgood (2) daughter of Christopher (2) Osgood and his first wife Mary Everard, Mary Osgood was born in Marlboro, England, and baptised March 17, 1633. She died July 15, 1675.

John (1) married 2nd, Hannah Pritchard, widow of Wm. Pritchard who was killed at Brookfield Aug. 2, 1675 in the Indian wars on Ipswich. They, John and Hannah, were married Nov. 12, 1676; She died Aug. 1, 1705 of cancer of the throat; John died Nov. 7, 1690.

They lived in the North Parish near Wilson's Corner,

She was the widow of James Turner of Charlestown, and was daughter of John Lazelle and Elizabeth Cates of Hingham. Hannah was b. Aug. 31, 1662; d. in Andover, May 22, 1717.
- John (2), b. Feb. 9, 1655; d. July 14, 1680; m. Naomi Hoyt, March 23, 1678, daughter of John (2) Hoyt of Newbury, and his 2nd wife Frances.

 Naomi was b. Jan. 25, 1655 in Newbury. John (2) was a soldier in the Narragansett War. They probably lived on John 's (1) division lots in West Parish.

Naomi had a daughter, B. Naomi, in 1684, while she was a widow, and it is so recorded under Abbott; date not given. Her children were placed by John (1) under the guardianship of their uncle Ebenezer (2), at home. Naomi m. 2nd, Richard Shattuck, a son of Samil Shattuck and Mary Frye, and nephew of Capt. John Frye. Richard was b. in Concord, Mass., Vec. 21, 1664; d. 1703. His dad Eunice Potter but had no children.)

Naomi d. before 1699 in Charlestown, leaving one son, Ichabod Shattuck. Richard m. 2nd Margaret Sheafe, Apr. 8, 1699, who outlived him, and m. 2nd a Parker, after 1727; she d. 1780.

John's children left Andover and went to Windham Co. . Ct.

The first Lovejoy estates are said to have been on the site of the Initarian Parsonage in North Andover Centre and along the road to South Parish, held last by the heirs of Capt. Lovejoy.

About 1760, Isaac Abbott, a son-in-law, built a mansion still standing, which matched the one built by his cousin flenry on the site of the Andover Press Building. Same style of architecture as the Ben Boynton place in West Andover which was built by Zebediah Abbott who married another Lovejoy daughter. All three homes were built in the same period by the same contractor. One old estate was on High St., and some think Wm. had his home across from old Stephen Mooar's place, occupied last by Wm. Brown. Coshua Lovejoy's estate lay there at the end and ran to the Locke place on the Haverhill Road and included Marland Village Mills, then Lovejoy Mills. High St. was called Lovejoy Lane.

Anne (2), b. Dec. 21, 1659; d. Feb. 29,1724. Her stone is standing in South Church yard. She m. May 26, 1685 Jonathan Blanchard, son of Sam Blanchard and Mary Sweetzer, b. 1663; d. Oct. 19, 1742; he m. 2nd Hannah Wyman, widow of Timothy of Woburn, Feb. 1, 1725. She died head-/before him and is buried near 1st wife. Her/stone and his stone are gone.

 Dorothy Hoyt, daughter of John (3) Hoyt and Mary Barnes, b. Jan.2,

 1674, a niece of Nathe's brother's 2nd wife, Naomi. Her father

One of the most interesting lines in Andover:

Baird: S.French Hugenots of America, gives the French refugees of Salem, among whom were the Valpeys, in 1661. The tale is from this family, to the effect that the Valpey who came first, was from the Isle of Jersey, and with his mates was lost from a fishing fleet in an open boat, and drifted down from the Banks, perhaps to Salem Harbor, or where Salem mariners picked them up. He never returned.

Abraham Valpey of Salem married Elizabeth Fowle, Sept. 28, 1728, and our line descends from her.

Dorcas Abbott, born March 26, 1782, daughter of Jonathan (5) Abbott and Dorcas Abbott, married George Valpey, of Salem, and these were parents of Samuel S. Valpey of Andover. Jonathan (5), above, was son of Jonathan (4) and Martha Lovejoy Abbott, so Samuel Valpey was grandson of Martha Lovejoy, while his wife was a grandaughter of Lucy Lovejoy.

Seldom do lines so far apart unite, but the children of this union have in a marked degree the beauty of the Lovejoy eye, so noticeable in the line of taleb Abbott.

As the Valpeys are a small line and will never be written up save as French Hugenots, perhaps I will soon prepare my Valpey sketch and annex it to this blank.

Jeremiah (5) Lovejoy (wife Hannah Johnson) built a house on the north part of the Lovejoy division, which has decayed, - a lonesome place on a back road and not inhabited today. Mostly wood lots.

The Ballards and Johnsons who were kin to his wife left for Danville, Me., then recently settled, and Jeremiah Probably tried a short residence there. Very likely more of the children will be found recorded there.

I conclude that the young man, Josiah Johnson Lovejoy who died here in Andover in 1807, age 22, had returned to live here or to visit his grandparents. He was not buried in the West Yard, or at least no stone was raised.

I find Jeremiah and wife Hannah in the South Church records, as joining, Dec. 7, 1788, and their dismissal to Danwille, Me., Nov. 29, 1792.

Dorothy Lovejoy, wife of Asa Towns, and daughter of Jeremiah and Dorothy (Ballard) Lovejoy, was in Andover a while, and in Boxford, when Asa ran off to War in 1812; their son John, lived in Salem and became a trader in Boston, -groceries- and later had a clothing bazaar at Oak Hall.

Another son, Henry, was a sea captain of Salem; another, Joseph, was a trader there; daughter Sarah married Deacon Oliver Reabody of Boxford, where they lived until they moved to Topsfield. They had 3 daughters and two sons.

Dorothy took a letter to Weare, N.H. from South Church in 1802.

Lieut. Asa Towne was of a family that became prominent in the Witch

trials of 1692, and on his mother's side was of an ancient Topsfield line.

Asa and his brother Daniel came to Andover and were associated in the building of the Wooden Bridge over the Merrimac River at Bodwell's Falls, on the site of the present bridge. They also constructed the South Church edifice that preceded the present building. They were in Andover between 1788-1800.

Some failure of contract obliged Asa to leave to avoid prosecution for debt or mismanagement, and he resided in Charlestown after 1804, when he and Dolly, his wife, took out letters from South Church, which they had joined in 1795.

As a seems too young for an extended service in the Revolution, but could have entered the Army at 16. His military service after the war was the origin of the title.

Tradition says that Asa French, husband of Mary (5), (Jeremiah (4)) Lovejoy, was of Concord. Her son, Asa, (and probably more children,) b. in Weare, N.H., was a rover, as was John French, the next son. Mary took a letter from South Church to Weare, #.H. in 1802.

**Rev. George Mooar in the Mooar Geneology, said that Oscar A. Mooar, a soldier from Andover in Co.1, 2nd Regt. N.H. Volunteers, died in Salisbury Prison, North Carolina, Feb. 14, 1865.

This soldier was the son of Abiah (7) Lovejoy and Andrew Allen Mooar, and grandson of Bodwell (6) Lovejoy and Sally Poor.

Probably the friends in Andover, where he buried, thought he was killed on some battlefield. Later he was discovered to have been kept in prison, where he died.

Some soldier thought to have been Oscar, may have been sent home for burial in 1863, as the monument erected over the grave gives the date off death: July 31, 1863.

Or it is possible that a soldier took the name of Oscar after

the real owner's death in 1863 (?) and died a stranger but drew the pay

of Oscar until he was taken prisoner?

One of War's mysteries.

The lady who told me this was a daughter of William Bailey and sister of Persis .

James Ballard Lovejoy suffered greatly from a carbunule on his head for ten years, and finally lost his reason as a result.

He came back from Freeport, Me., and bought a farm here in Andover, 1807; Hannah, his widow, said she had lived there ever since and that all save three of her children were born there.

In March, 18961 Albert A. Lovejoy gave up his position as engineer in the Davis & Furber Machine Shop of North Andover, which he had retained for 13 years. He was the last of the original employees who started, in 1880 with the plant.

At the age of 17, Albert began his apprenticeship with Bradford Burden. Later he became overseer in the "jack" room and "built the first "Jack" that ever spun a thread in Lawrence", the machine being in the Bay State Mill. He was foreman from 1846-1852; overseer of loom room 1854-1863. Until 1880 he held various positions in Methuen and Lynn, returning to North Andover when Davis & Furber struck their stride.

Faithful and efficient, highly respected by associates, the decision of Mr. Lovejoy and his wife to spend their old years in Hartland, Vt., was deeply regretted by their townspeople.

An article in the Townsman 1896, notes that an Albert Lovejoy, 4th child of Henry Lovejoy and Elizabeth Poor of West Parish, was borm in 1821, near "Butler's Cave". This was a place on the Merrimack River below Dracut now included in Andover but near the Lawrence line. His mother was said to be a native of Rindge, N.H., and as I could not find her birth here, I should place her in Rindge, as her father was a pioneer there, but I do not know her age at death.

NOTES - HOMES-

Stephen Lovejoy lived in the old James Cochrane's second place which his widow Salome sold when she bought a third home for herself. This, in 1864, was the John Hardy property. Old William Hardy said that a RICHFORD lived on the place before James Cochrane got it, and, before Hardy took it, Friend Moore, who sold hard liquor under the guise of FISH and had to skip from town, was the owner.

Isaac Lovejoy 's place was on a lane next to Amos Moore's and beyond Capt. B. Shattuck and Fred Noyes; beyond him was Rufus Bailey's homestead, where Henry Lovejoy, son of Isaac, built at his marriage, and lived, up to the time of his death.

Wm. Lovejoy lived in the Chandler Abbott house in 1800. He is said to have built part of the dam, probably the one at Lawrence.

Deacon Eben Lovejoy built the Carruth place on the site of the old,

's g-father

(the year of the Great Gales) and sold to Carruth in 1837. Eben/set out

an elm tree back of the barn, but that is gone now.

Eben Lovejoy's home was a building put up for a store opposite the School House near the Bond. It stood west of W. Griffin's place, and I think that Aaron Osgood kept store there for a long while. Bartlett lived in it when he had a blacksmith shop there. When he gave up the business the old shop was moved to the John Lovejoy place for a stable, then sold again, and it wound up on Seminary Hill somewhere.

John Lovejoy, brother of Eben, lived opposite. He was a very deaf man, or blind- and Josiah Edwin Griffin lived with him and helped carry on the farm, in 1862/

NOTES* HOMES -2-

In the next house to John Lovejoy, lived Mrs. Hannah Lovejoy, widow of old James Ballard Lovejoy, whose husband built on the lot of the present Dr. Nehemiah Abbott's. Mrs. Lovejoy bought the land from Hugh Ewing, an Irishman, who lived in old house on the place. Ewing owned the land where her son Wm. Bailey lived, in 1863; Wm. Hardy hired it before 1800. A Boston man named Hurd once owned the Bailey Lovejoy home and used to come up for the summers. Francis Butler of Haverhill was also a tenant.

Poor called on Bailey Lovejoy, who had lived there since 1844. Six Lombardy poplars stood before the home then, when they came.

Near Goodell Gilbert's home, a few rods away, stood a white cottage where Deacon Ballard Lovejoy lived in 1835. Southeast stood Gideon Foster's, an old home, probably left by the father of Gideon.

Mehitabel, widow of Joshua Lovejoy, lived/next house to the Fielding's, in 1863.

Ebenezer Lovejoy built a house on Blanchard's Plain and Joshua Osggod went to live in it. This was the father of Joseph Thompson Lovejoy, and the house was where Jo now lives. In fact, Jo's may be the 1st of three houses on the property. I called there once and saw a square house, which he said came from the Woods' place, beside the old one of her father, and the new residence.

Capt. Nathe (4) Lovejoy and his 1st wife, Elizabeth Foster, daughter of Asa Foster and Elizabeth Abbott, of Boxford, came to West Andover with Ebenezer (2) and Christopher (2) in the syndicate that bought so much land there.

The LOVEJOY FAMILY NOTES - HOMES-3-

Asa Foster inherited a large farm there. At the death of his first wife he married Lucy Rogers, and lived near the site of the Charles Shattuck place. The Marquis de Chastellux visited during Lucy's reign, and called it a wretched place "fit only to bait horses". Probably he had only poor liquor, as times were hard.

Asa was a valiant Capt. in the French War Expedition to Canada.

From the Osgood Almanac:

Joshua Lovejoy had a mill-wheel down by the Marland Mills. Eittle David Osgood toddling along the banks, fell into the stream and went through the wheel, unharmed. He later fought in the Kevolution and lost his life there. Joshua raised his home, on the site of the present one, on June 5, 1746.

Mary Lovejoy, daughter of foshua (4) married James Parker. They lived on the Stephen Mooar place on High St.

Isaac Lovejoy married the widow of Eliahin Wardwell, and lived ,in a house since burned down, on land now known as the Roger Downing place. The house stood in a peach orchard across the street from Downing's, when I was a child.

Mr. Frye thought that the old John Lovejoy home was the Chandler Mooar place on High St, taken down in 1831. High St. ran from Frye Village past Osgood's- now the Poor Farm.

Isaac (5) Lovejoy lived near Lawrence where James Toy lived in 1864.

Nathan Lovejoy, belonging to a unit called a "company of shipwrights" is recorded as at Boston, enlisted for the Crown Point expedition.

Jeremiah Lovejoy is a member of a company under Capt. Jn. Foster, July 24, 1756.

Timothy Lovejoy is credited with 15 weeks service in 1756. Earlier in the year, from Sept. 20 to Jan. 12, 1856, he has 27 weeks to his credit- and the loss of a blanket and fire arms in a battle, and travel from Andover to Boston. He was also in service May 7, 1756, with John and Joseph Shackford under Capt. James Frye.

The Lovejoys have the "substitute papers" of Ebenezer, in the French War.:

(The SON was Jeremiah (4) the only surviving son of old Ebenezer, and he could not be spared from the farm.)

The only service of Capt. Nath'l Lovejoy I can find, is at Dorchester Heights at the forts there, and he had some supervision at the time of the the Evacuation of Boston.

Sam'l Osgood, appointed to the staff of General Ward had resigned because he had no taste for war,-it is said,-or military work anyway. Possibly the two Branden women who were so well acquainted with Boston officers-held Tory sentiments, and did all they could to keep these two men at home.

Sam(1 Osgood served on the Board of War with the Provincial Congress and became the 1st P.M. General. Nathan Lovejoy was a trainer of men rather than a leader, and Sam Phillips the same- no military genius.

" Mr. Sergt. Stevens came from Sergt. Beldin's and neare my mother Rowell's (old Mrs. Osgood) stile I observed him to reele coming to me. I asked him HOW HE DID. He said pretty well, - but the liquor did fume in his head.

a little after, coming out of my mother's home he went to ye east and stood theere a little while, then lay down complaining then of his head and stomach. People come to and fro. I was willing to get him in to the house and I took him to lead him in and he was so overcome as that he was not able to go nor stand, nor did he draw back unwilling to go but was like a child newly learning to goe.

And laying him on the bed he then cried out of drinking the liquors and being overcome with them, and many such expressions he used complaining that they flamed his head and burned in his stomach, or words to this purpose, and WAS MUCH TROUBLED THAT HIS WIFE SHOULD KNOW OF IT.

On the way to the house as we led him in/we slacked our hold he dropped down.

The deposed further affirmeth that if he ever saw any drunk in his life. HE WAS DRUNK.

Likewise by the way to Andover Sergt. Stevens said he was never so CATCHED in his life. It may well be called "Kill Devil " for he thought it would kill devil and man too."

(This was occasioned by asking HOW HE DID!)
