CARLETON FAMILY

OF ANDOVER

At one time we believed we had it firmly established that the line of descent was from Baldwin (1) of Carleton Hall, in Cumberland, 1066, to Edward (17) Lord of the Manor of East Cloud in Surrey, 1562, who had for a wife, Mary Bigby, daughter of George Bigby of Cobham in Surrey.

About 1911, an enterprising searcher discovered in York, England, a record of the marriage of Edward Carleton, yeoman, of Barnston, and Ellen Newton, spinster, of St. Martin's, Micklegate, York, on Nov.3, 1636. She was a daughter of John and Mary Newton of York, and was born about 1615. Her father was a lawyer.

The alleged Coat of Arms and fake pedigree, were disputed in 1904. Edward (1) Carleton got here in 1638, with the Rev. Zekiel Rogers' colony, and as that company started from York, we believe we have found the right Edward. He was an important member of the Colony, represented Rowley, was Justice of the Peace and helped settle land disputes. He went back to England with his family before 1661, and sent his son, John, over here to settle his affairs. According to deeds, he, Edward (1), had a large estate at Ayers Village, West Haverhill.

This son, John (2) Carleton, was born in England. He was Town Clerk in Rowley and lived near the Bradford line. He was a Lieut. of Militia. He married Hannah Jewett, daughter of Jos. Jewett of Rowley. He died in Haverhill, Jan.22, 1669. Hannah took for a 2nd., husband, Christopher Babbidge of Salem. John(2) Carleton's estate was valued at L90 in 1650. He drew Division Rights to 53 lots, Feb.28,1661, for the first time. In 1664 he was chosen to keep the Town records and was Clerk of Writs, and held the office until 1669.

Essex Ct. records tell of a fight between John Carleton and Robert Swan in which blows were exchanged. John Carleton, being more wealthy, was fined b 3 for the offense, while Robert Swan, a poor man, paid 30 sheet
